**GEORGIA HOSTS SEC-LEADING AGGIES IN SATURDAY STEGEMAN MATINÉE**

Texas A&M, the lone remaining undefeated team in Southeastern Conference play, visits Stegeman Coliseum on Saturday for 2 p.m. matchup with the Georgia Bulldogs.

**And while Georgia's strength of schedule has ranked among the nation's top 10 for almost the entire season, the Aggies represent the Bulldogs' first ranked opponent of the 2015-16 campaign.** A&M arrives in Athens checking in at No. 14 in this week's USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 15 in the Associated Press top-25 ledger.

**Georgia improved to 9-5 overall and 2-2 in the SEC** with an 81-72 come-from-behind victory over Tennessee on Wednesday evening. The Bulldogs' trailed by as many as nine points (43-34 with 16:55 remaining) before J.J. Frazier and Kenny Gaines ignited a furious comeback. Frazier and Gaines combined to score 25 straight UGA points as Georgia turned a 43-36 deficit with 15:46 left into a 61-54 lead at the 7:59 mark.

**Overall, Yante Maten continues to lead the Bulldogs and rank among SEC leaders in scoring (No. 11 at 16.3 ppg), No. 9 in rebounding (7.5 rpg), blocks (No. 7 at 1.6 bpg) and FG percentage (No. 4 at .554).**

**Frazier and Maten both are averaging a team-best 16.3 ppg in SEC play.**

**In stats for league games only, Frazier currently ranks among leaders in nine different categories – No. 1 in steals, No. 2 in FT percentage, No. 3 in 3-point percentage, No. 7 in 3-pointers per game, No. 8 in assists, No. 9 in both FG percentage and assist-to-TOs, No. 10 in rebounding and No. 13 scoring.**

**Texas A&M sports records of 14-2 overall and 4-0 in the SEC.**

**The Aggies feature a balanced offensive attack led by seniors Jalen Jones at 17.6 ppg and Danuel House at 16.1 ppg.** Freshman Tyler Davis also is chipping in double-digit scoring (10.9 ppg), while four more A&M players are averaging between 7.0-7.6 ppg.

**SERIES HISTORY WITH TAMU**

**Georgia is 4-0 all-time against Texas A&M since the Aggies joined the SEC in 2012.**

Last season in College Station, Kenny Gaines scored 15 points to lead Georgia in a pivotal 62-53 road victory over Texas A&M on Feb. 11 at Reed Arena.

As a team, the Bulldogs committed a season-low seven turnovers.

"We played a tournament game tonight," Mark Fox said. "We took care of the ball and Charles Mann was really, really good with the ball in his hands, as were most of the guys around him."

Georgia led 34-31 at halftime before the teams exchanged leads four times in the opening seven minutes of the second stanza.

Up three, Georgia began extending the margin when Taylor Echols drained a 3-pointer to open up a six-point Bulldog lead with 7:40 to play.

"I thought the basket Echols made off the bench was key," said Fox. "We were in serious foul trouble and needed that."

**In the most recent meeting at Stegeman Coliseum on Feb. 8, 2014, Gaines scored 14 points to pace the Bulldogs in a 62-50 decision over the Aggies.**

Georgia used an 11-4 run to take a 25-18 advantage with just two minutes remaining in the half. Texas A&M, however, scored the period's final five points, including a 3-pointer at the buzzer, to shrink the deficit to 25-23 at the halftime break.

The Aggies took a 40-39 lead at the midpoint in the second half, but the Bulldogs quickly went back on top with a 5-0 run and never trailed again.

**LAST TIME OUT**

J.J. Frazier and Kenny Gaines combined for 51 points to lead Georgia to an 81-72 victory over Tennessee Wednesday night in Athens.

Trailing 43-34 with 16:55 to go the Bulldogs went on a 29-11 run to seize control. Yante Maten started and ended that stretch with buckets, with Frazier and Gaines combining to score the other 25 Georgia points in between.

"That was a really hard fought SEC game like most of them are going to be," Mark Fox said. "I did not think that we started the game with the mentality we were hoping for. I was extremely concerned on how we would respond following last game, and I said eventually we have to show our character and fight back. That's all we talked about and eventually we got back to being ourselves."

**J.J. ALMOST EVERYWHERE IN SEC STATS**

In statistics for SEC games only, junior J.J. Frazier is ranked among the league's leaders in nine of 11 major categories.

The 5-10, junior from Glennville, Ga., is currently No. 1 in steals (3.0 spg), No. 2 in FT percentage (.909), No. 3 in 3-point percentage (.611), No. 7 in 3-pointers per game (2.8 3FGpg), No. 8 in assists (4.5 apg), No. 9 in both FG percentage (.512) and assist-to-TOs (2.0), No. 10 in rebounding (7.0 rpg) and No. 13 scoring (16.3 ppg).

The only two categories where Frazier is not listed are blocks and minutes.

No other player in the league is ranked in more than five stats. Moses Kingsley of Arkansas and Tyler Ullis of Kentucky both are listed in five categories.

**DOGS REWRITE DICKENS VS. VOLTS**

Sincerest of apologies to literature professors on UGA's North campus; however, it's too easy to compare Georgia's game versus Tennessee with Charles Dickens' novel "A Tale of Two Cities."

As in "It was the worst of halves, it was the best of halves, it was the age of foolishness, it was the age of wisdom."

Georgia produced a season-low 28 first-half points against the Volunteers, largely due to committing 16 turnovers in the opening 20 minutes of action.

The Bulldogs followed that with a season-best 53 second-half points. That was one of several season-high tallies after intermission. Georgia also produced its most second-half field goals (19), 3-pointers (seven) and rebounds (25).

**TODAY'S TELECAST GOES "REMI"**

While you won't see any announcers during today's game, the contest is airing live nationally on ESPNU.

The game is a "REMI" telecast by ESPN, with the announcers calling the action from studios in Charlotte, N.C., instead of on site at Stegeman Coliseum.

This will be third time play-by-play announcer Mike Morgan and analyst Chris Spatola have called a Georgia game this season. They also did outings against High Point and Florida...in person.

**OGBEIDE BACK, MAKING BIG STRIDES**

Following an injury-induced detour, freshman Derek Ogbeide (pronounced "Ohwg-Bay-Day") is showing signs of becoming an inside presence for the Bulldogs.

Ogbeide enjoyed a very impressive unofficial debut for Georgia. In a Nov. 6 exhibition win over Armstrong State, he grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds, scored four points and recorded one assist, block and steal in 19 minutes of action.

Ogbeide suffered a right shoulder injury in practice thereafter and missed Georgia's first five games of the season.

He finally made his official premiere against Kansas State, checking at the 17:27 mark of the first half versus the Wildcats and playing two minutes in the contest.

"He was just cleared today a little before 2 o'clock," Mark Fox said. "I just wanted to get him 45 seconds here and there just to get him to relax and so he'd been out there before."

The day before the Kansas State contest Fox was asked about what Georgia was missing without Ogbeide.

"He would allow us to impose our size and physicality on people" Fox said.

The Pebblebrook High School product now is helping Georgia doing just that.

Ogbeide played a combined five minutes against Kansas State and Winthrop before UGA's 11-day break for Final Exams. In the seven games since, Ogbeide is averaging 5.1 points and 6.1 rebounds in 14.4 minutes.

His impact has been even more dramatic in SEC play.

Ogbeide, who earned his first career start against Tennessee, is averaging 6.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg and 16.5 mpg. In stats for SEC games only, he ranks No. 10 in rebounding and is the only player averaging less than 20 minutes per game.

In fact, equating out to 40-minute production makes Ogbeide the league's most proficient rebounder as outlined below.

**THE OGBEIDE EFFECT ON UGA**

In addition to his individual contributions, the significance of Derek Ogbeide's addition to the Bulldogs regular playing rotation is readily apparent.

**Following the Kansas State loss on Dec. 4, Georgia was 3-3 with a +1.2 scoring margin.**

**Since then, the Bulldogs are 6-2 with a with a scoring margin of +8.9.** That stretch includes double-digit wins over three "Power 5" schools – Georgia Tech (75-61), Clemson (71-48) and Missouri (77-59) – as well as Robert Morris, an NCAA Tournament participant last season with four returning starters.

**DOGS' "D" HAS BEEN CONSISTENT**

The Bulldogs currently rank No. 7 nationally in field goal defense, holding opponents to just 36.8 percent shooting from the floor.

Georgia has held each 13 of its 14 opponents – and all 10 non-conference foes – under their field goal percentage for the season. The Bulldogs have forced foes to a shooting performance more than 10 percent lower than their season effort. Most notably, **High Point, which currently ranks No. 10 in field goal percentage at .498, shot .297 versus UGA.**

During the 2015 calendar portion of the schedule, Georgia's opponents connected on a paltry 36.6 percent (218-of-596) of their shots from the field against the Bulldogs. Subtract out those totals and UGA's opposition made 45.8 percent (3203-of-6990) of their field goals attempted.

Florida became the first team this season shoot a better percentage against Georgia than otherwise. The Gators entered their SEC opener shooting 42.2 percent but then converted on 42.3 – yes, .1 of one percent better – against the Bulldogs.

The Bulldogs have since started a new streak by holding Missouri (44.2 percent entering game to 34.5), Ole Miss (43.1 to 36.2 percent) and Tennessee (44.3 to 37.9 percent) under their regular percentages.

**GAINES, MANN REWRITING RECORDS**

Seniors Kenny Gaines and Charles Mann are making their mark on Georgia Basketball's career scoring ledger.

Mann entered the season at No. 36 among the Bulldogs' all-time points leaders and has already ascended to No. 25. He now has scored 1,188 points, 42 away from the current No. 24, Ray Harrison.

Gaines became Georgia's 46th 1,000-point career scorer against Clemson on Dec. 22. He is now up to the No. 33 slot with 1,082 points, seven points from No. 32 Joe Ward, 17 from No. 31 Travis Leslie and 18 from No. 30 Michael Chadwick.

**BULLDOGS IN THE BPI & RPI**

Georgia is No. 46 in the ESPN's Basketball Power Index (BPI) and No. 66 in the NCAA's Ratings Percentage Index (RPI).

The Bulldogs' strength of schedule, which was ranked as the nation's toughest in both computer ledgers for a good bit of December, is currently listed at No. 12 in the BPI and No. 16 in the RPI.

## GEORGIA MAKING THE GRADE

Georgia has enjoyed great success both on the court and in the classroom during Mark Fox's tenure with the Bulldogs.

Georgia has three 20-win campaigns under Fox and is the midst of its winningest three-year stretch in SEC play ever (32 victories).

**All told, 24 Bulldogs – including former NBA players Jarvis Hayes and Damien Wilkins – have graduated from UGA since Fox arrived in 2009.** That tally features a current and former Bulldog who received their diplomas on Dec. 18.

Junior Juwan Parker earned his degree in Management, impressively in just two and a half years after his arrival in Athens. He will begin pursuing a master's degree in Sport Management in January.

Adrian Jones, who played for the Bulldogs from 1997-01, also secured his bachelor's in Recreation and Leisure Studies. Three more – Kenny Gaines, Houston Kessler and Charles Mann – are on track to add to that total in May.

Georgia's academic successes are evident in the two primary tracking systems of the NCAA – the Academic Performance Rate (APR) and Graduation Success Rate (GSR). The Bulldogs are one of two SEC schools to receive public recognition from the NCAA for having an APR among the nation's top-10 percent twice in the past three years. In October, the NCAA announced that Georgia has a 100 percent GSR for its 2014-15 measuring window.

### A POSITIVE BREAKOUT

Not that the media needs any self affirmation but the folks who predicted Yante Maten would be one of the nation's "breakout" players this season – including those at CBS, NBC and SI – are probably feeling pretty good.

Most expected Maten to up his contributions following the departure of seniors front-court mates Nemanja Djurisic and Marcus Thornton. He's done more than just that.

A year ago, Maten averaged 5.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 18.2 minutes per game.

**This season, Maten has more than tripled his scoring (16.3 ppg) and also has upped both his rebounding (7.5 rpg) and playing time (29.9 mpg) by massive chunks.**

Maten posted four career-high scoring outputs in the Bulldogs' first seven games this season, improving from 13 points entering the year to 17 points versus Chattanooga to 21 points in the opener to back-to-back outings against Seton Hall and Oakland and 24 points versus Winthrop.

### MANN'S VERSATILITY NOT JUST HYPE

It's not uncommon to hear a comment like "Ya know, he could play all five positions."

Charles Mann has proven that isn't idle hyperbole when discussing his game.

**Mann, one of two Bulldogs along with Yante Maten to start every game this season, got the nod at four different positions during Georgia's first eight outings.**

He started at his natural '1' slot in five games but also did so at the '2' versus Winthrop, at the '3' against Georgia Tech and at the '5' – yes the '5' – against Chattanooga.

**Against High Point, Mann saw action at all five spots. Perhaps most impressive was his defensive effort in several matchups with John Brown, the nation's No. 4 active scorer.**

"He's been so unselfish and willing to do that and has not complained one time," Mark Fox said.

### UGA'S ALL-SEC TANDEM...

**Senior guards Kenny Gaines and Charles Mann were both named preseason first-team All-SEC in balloting of league coaches. In the process, they became just the second duo of Bulldogs to earn first-team preseason honors since the recognition began prior to the 2004-05 season.** Travis Leslie and Trey Thompkins were also first-team selections prior to the 2010-11 season.

**In addition, Mann became Georgia's first-ever two-time first-team preseason All-SEC selection.**

### ...HAS VERY STRONG TIES

The duo of Peach State natives Kenny Gaines, who is from Atlanta, and Charles Mann, who hails from Alpharetta, has played a significant role since they arrived on campus in 2012.

**Between them, Gaines and Mann have a combined 218 games played, 160 starts and 5,570 minutes played.**

Much of that has been compiled together. **Gaines and Mann have started together for 71 of Georgia's 81 contests since the beginning of their sophomore year of 2013-14. All told, they have played 1,718 minutes and 20 seconds together at Georgia.**

### UGA IN MIDST OF MOST SEC SUCCESS

**Georgia entered SEC play looking to expand on its most successful two- and three-year stretches in league play ever.**

The Bulldogs finished 11-7 and tied for third in the SEC last season. That followed a 12-6 record in 2013-14 when Georgia tied for second in the league and a 9-9 effort in 2012-13.

**The Bulldogs' 32 wins over the past three seasons and 23 during the past two campaign represent UGA's most ever.**

**Georgia is one of only two teams to secure a top-4 seed to each of the past two SEC Tournaments, along with Kentucky. The Bulldogs and Wildcats also are the only two teams to reach the semifinals of both the 2014 and 2015 SEC Tournays.**

### SMALL IN STATURE, BIG ON BOARDS

J.J. Frazier grabbed 10 rebounds against Winthrop on Dec. 8. In the process, the junior from Glennville became the most prominent name on a list of Division I players under 6-feet tall.

A year ago, Frazier was among seven players under 6-feet who recorded a double-figure rebounding effort. He hauled in 11 boards against Seton Hall.

With his performance against Winthrop, Frazier joined five other under-6-foot players with 10 or more rebounds this season.

**Frazier and Frank Mason III of Kansas are the only players in the nation under 6-feet to have a double-figure rebounding performance in each of the past two seasons for much of the season.** Mason has 10 rebounds against Texas Tech this season and 10 versus Michigan State in 2014-15.

### AND A WELL-ROUNDED EFFORT

Along with his 10 boards, J.J. Frazier also scored 15 points – for his first career double-double – and handed out five assists versus Winthrop.

**Frazier became just the third Georgia player to post 15 points, 10 rebounds and five assists during Mark Fox's six-plus seasons as the Bulldogs' head coach.**

Travis Leslie did so twice, both against Vanderbilt. Leslie had 21 points, 13 rebounds and five assists against the Commodores on Jan. 12, 2011, and also notched 22 points, 10 boards and five assists versus Vandy on Feb. 25, 2010. In addition, Trey Thompkins had 23 points, 14 rebounds and six assists against Arkansas in the first round of the SEC Tournament on March 11, 2010.

### GAINES, FRAZIER EARN SEC HONORS

**Kenny Gaines and J.J. Frazier were tabbed SEC Player of the Week on Nov. 23 and Dec. 21, respectively.**

Gaines, who shared the honor with Kentucky's Tyler Ulis, was selected after his career-high 35-point outburst against Murray State. **Gaines accounted for a school-record 55.6 percent of UGA's points in the 63-52 win.** He also equaled the No. 15 single-game scoring output by a Bulldog, as well as tying marks for No. 6 in 3-pointers made (7) and No. 5 in 3-pointers attempted (14).

**Frazier was chosen after he scored 35 points against Georgia Tech, the highest output ever by a Bulldog against the Yellow Jackets.** Frazier also dished out four assists, meaning he had a hand in 43 (57.3 percent) of the Bulldogs' 75 points in the contest. He scored 22 second-half points and converted on 8-of-8 attempts at the line in the final 1:29 to ice the game's outcome.

The last UGA teammates to be tabbed SEC Player of the Week in the same season were Travis Leslie and Trey Thompkins in 2009-10.

### MORE PT FOR KPG

Kenny Paul Geno entered the 2015-16 season with a career high of 21 minutes played against Missouri late last season.

**This season, Geno is averaging 22.0 minutes of action per game.** The Booneville, Miss., native has matched or bettered his previous career-most MP in eight games during 2015-16, including a new career-best of 35 versus Chattanooga.

Geno averaged 3.8 minutes as a freshman in 2013-14. He had earned increased playing time last season before suffering a broken left wrist in the SEC opener against Arkansas and missing 10 games following surgery.

Geno returned to log double-digit minutes in eight of the Bulldogs' final nine outings of 2014-15 and secured a starting nod for six of the last eight games.

**Geno started the first seven games this season, compiling a stretch of 13 starts in 15 outings dating back to last season.** He has been coming off the bench for the Bulldogs beginning with the Georgia Tech game on Dec. 19.

**MATEN A 20-POINT REGULAR**

Yante Maten notched seven 20-point performances in a 10-game span from Nov. 28-Jan. 9, including a streak of four straight against Seton Hall, Oakland, Kansas State and Winthrop.

That represented UGA's first four-game 20-point string since Trey Thompkins recorded five straight 20-point outings in February of 2010.

During that stretch, Maten averaged 18.6 ppg and made 60.2 percent of his shots from the floor and 79.0 percent of his free throws.

**FRAZIER, GAINES POP FOR 35 EACH**

J.J. Frazier and Kenny Gaines became the first pair of UGA teammates to score 35 points or more during the same season.

Gaines poured in 35 points against Murray State on Nov. 20, and Frazier then matched that output against Georgia Tech on Dec. 19.

Only four times have the Bulldogs had two 35-point performances in a single season, and the other three instances involved a single player doing so.

In 1952-53, Zippy Morocco scored 38 points vs. Tennessee and 37 vs. Alabama. In 1974-75, Jacky Dorsey posted 43 vs. Southern Miss and 41 vs. LSU. In 1990-91, Litterial Green notched 38 vs. UCLA and 35 vs. Florida.

Frazier, who also scored a career-high 37 at Mississippi State on Jan. 24 last season, joined the trio of aforementioned Bulldogs and Willie Anderson as the only five players ever to score 35 points or more two times for Georgia.

**GAINES PUTS UP RECORD PERCENTAGE**

Kenny Gaines scored 35 of Georgia's 63 points against Murray State on Nov. 20. His accounting for 55.6 percent of the Bulldogs' points that night represented the largest chunk by a single player in program history.

Gaines' performance was just the eighth time a Bulldog has scored half of Georgia's points going as far back as complete records for UGA Basketball exist (beginning with the 1960-61 season) as outlined below.

**FRAZIER SCORES, DISHES VERSUS UTC**

J.J. Frazier dished out a career-best eight assists versus the Chattanooga in the season opener, passes which immediately resulted in 20 points for Georgia.

Coupled with the 22 points Frazier scored himself means he had a hand in 42 of UGA's 90 points against the Mocs.

**THE MOST...FOULS...EVER**

A great deal of digging through dusty files (by intern Brandon Weiss) revealed that the 63 combined fouls against Chattanooga is likely the most ever in a Georgia game.

UGA archives provide complete box scores beginning with the 1960-61 season. No game since then – all 1,649 of them from the start of the 1960-61 campaign through the matchup with the Mocs – featured as many as fouls.

In fact, only one contest featured 60 fouls. On Feb. 17, 2007, Georgia and Auburn committed 27 and 33 infractions, respectively.

**B.Y. RECEIVES A SCHOLLY**

Following two seasons as a walk-on, Brandon Young has been placed on scholarship. Mark Fox announced the move during Georgia Basketball's preseason banquet on Tuesday, Nov. 3.

Fox introduced each player on the Bulldogs' roster alphabetically before arriving at Young, the final name in that process.

"Brandon grew up in a family that loves the University of Georgia," Fox said. "He grew up – much like Houston (Kessler) – bleeding Red and Black. But what I love about 'B.Y.' – and I think our players would say the same thing – is that Brandon Young epitomizes everything that a Georgia Bulldog should be. He's a great student. He's a wonderful person. He is a terrific player. He is the best teammate – would everyone agree? – the best teammate on this team. Because of all that 'B.Y.' I think we should give you a scholarship tonight."

Young was subsequently mobbed by all of his teammates.

Young was a two-sport standout in basketball and football at the Marist School in Atlanta before joining the Bulldogs in 2013.

Young played in 10 games as a freshman and logged action in seven contests last season, including Georgia's NCAA Tournament matchup with Michigan State. He received the team's Most Inspirational Award last season.

**A CHALLENGING NON-CONFERENCE**

Georgia's 11 non-conference opponents this season averaged 19.3 wins a year ago and compiled an average NCAA RPI of 115.

"Our goal was a non-conference schedule that would put us in a proper position with the strength of schedule numbers at the end of the year," Mark Fox said. "You never know what kind of season a team will have, but with the numbers from last year I think we've been able to establish the strength of schedule we need. It's a little tougher numbers-wise than a year ago. That's important when you get to the month of March."

**Eight of the 14 players on Georgia's 2015-16 roster are Peach State prep products.**

The Bulldogs who are playing for their state university are: seniors Kenny Gaines (Whitefield Academy in Atlanta) and Charles Mann (Milton High in Alpharetta); juniors J.J. Frazier (Faith Baptist Christian Academy in Glennville), Houston Kessler (Landmark Christian High in Newnan) and Brandon Young (Marist School in Atlanta); and freshmen William "Turtle" Jackson (Athens Christian School), Connor O'Neill (Blessed Trinity Catholic High in Roswell) and Derek Ogbeide (Pepplebrook High in Atlanta).

### BULLDOGS SIGN CRUMP, HARRIS

**Tyree Crump and Jordan Harris, a pair of premier perimeter players generally regarded as top-100 national prospects, signed letters-of-intent to play collegiately at Georgia on Wednesday, Nov. 11.**

Both players are from Southwest Georgia. Crump, who attends Bainbridge High School, and Harris, who is from Seminole County High School, inked their papers on the first day of the NCAA's week-long early signing period.

"We are excited to welcome both Tyree and Jordan into our program," head coach Mark Fox said. "They are both very talented basketball players from the state of Georgia who have grown up as fans of UGA and will now have the opportunity to play for the Dogs. We expect both of these guys to be great additions to our team."

Crump (6-2, 175) was named first-team All-State for Class 4A by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution as a junior after earning second-team recognition for Class 5A as a sophomore. Last season, Crump averaged 22.6 points, 4.7 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game for the Bearcats. That followed his averaging 22.4 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game as a sophomore when Bainbridge reached the quarterfinals of the state tournament. As a freshman, Crump contributed 14.3 ppg.

"Tyree is a very good athlete and has demonstrated a great ability to shoot and score," Fox said. "He is a very competitive young man who we certainly think will have a positive impact on our program in the very near future."

Harris (6-5, 175) was named 2015 Georgia Player of the Year for Class 2A by both the Georgia Sports Writers Association and the Atlanta Journal-Constitution after leading Seminole County to a state championship. Harris has been named All-State three times. He was a Class A honorable mention selection as a freshman and a second-team choice as a sophomore before Seminole County moved to Class 2A in 2014. Last season, Harris averaged 27.4 points, 11.2 rebounds, 7.2 assists, 3.6 steals and 1.9 blocks per game for the Indians.

"Jordan brings an element of length and athleticism into our program that we are very excited about," Fox said. "He has the ability to play multiple positions and we love the fact that he led his high school team to a state championship last year."
