» Know the Opponents: UK and VU «

Third-ranked Georgia will hit the road this week for a pair of SEC contests. The Bulldogs take on No. 23 Kentucky on Thursday before getting a rematch of last season's SEC championship match against Vanderbilt on Saturday in Nashville. The Wildcats, who are 1-4 in conference play, claim only one player with a winning record in SEC matches - Aldila Sutjiadi, who plays on the second court. UK has two players in the ITA singles rankings - Sutjiadi at No. 49 and Justina Mikulskyte at No. 76. The Wildcats also have the third-ranked doubles pairing in Sutjiadi and Mami Adachi, who are 8-2 on the year and 3-0 in conference play. Vanderbilt has three players among the ITA ranks, headlined by Frances Altick at No. 17. Astra Sharma checks in at No. 21 and Sydney Campbell is ranked 25th. Altick is 5-0 in conference play, whil Sharma and Campbell each claim three SEC wins. In doubles, the Commodores have the 10th and 58th-ranked pairings in Courtney Colton and Campbell and Colton/Sharma, respectively.

» In Wallace's Words «

Coach Wallace on this week's matchups: "It's always fun playing here at home. We've been doing well, and now we get to hit the road again. We had a lot of road matches earlier in the year and we've been home for a while, so here we go up to Kentucky and over to Nashville. They're two great teams. It should be two great matches. The SEC has been fun this year, watching everybody play and the different results. Everybody's good. It's the strongest conference in America, and we just need to be ready to go."

» Dawgs Start Strong in SEC «

The 5-0 team start to conference play wasn't the only terrific beginning to SEC play for Georgia. Three players -- Ellen Perez, Kennedy Shaffer and Laura Patterson boast perfect 5-0 singles records in the SEC. Perez owns wins over four ranked opponents in the early running, including an upset win over Missisippi State's Jasmine Lee. Shaffer has been her dependable self, winning all five singles matches with three clinchers. Patterson has showed out as a strong option on the No. 6 court with four straight-sets wins in four conference matches on 6, and she won a match on the No. 5 court in Georgia's win against Tennessee. Additionally, Mariana Gould is 2-0 in conference while playing on the No. 5 court.

» Sure as Shaffer «

Through 13 dual matches on the year, sophomore Kennedy Shaffer leads UGA with 12 singles victories. The Rossford, Ohio native has pulled off five upset victories in nine matches and is a strong 12-1 while splitting time between the No. 2 (3-1), No. 3 (5-0) and No. 4 (4-0) courts. Shaffer opened SEC play by clinching both of the Mississippi matches, and she even claimed a doubles point clincher along side Laura Patterson in a strong opening weekend. She followed her strong start with a clincher against Auburn a week later, and her lone loss on the year came to 13th-ranked Julia Elbaba of Virginia in three sets.

» Poll Presence «

The Bulldogs check in at No. 3 nationally after stretching their win streak to seven matches and claiming a win over then-No. 10 Virginia on Thursday at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex.. Four singles players grace the poll with Ellen Perez reaching her highest-ever ranking at No. 7. Caroline Brinson follows at No. 27, and Kennedy Shaffer (56) and Silvia Garcia (79) round out the ranked singles Bulldogs. Shaffer's slot at 56 is 22 spots higher than where she entered conference play, but her strong play on the second singles court helped propel her up the rankings. Additionally, the Bulldogs claim two ranked doubles pairs, with the top-court combo of Perez and Mariana Gould rising three spots to No. 25. The pairing of Shaffer and Garcia, which played together in the fall but has yet to play this spring, reached the polls at No. 63.

» Return of King «

Sophomore Hannah King, who missed the early stages of the season while rehabbing a surgically-repaired shoulder, returned this past weekend to claim a threeset win on the No. 6 court in Thursday's match against No. 10 Virginia. She also played in Saturday's match against Tennessee, though her match went unfinished.

» Good As Gould «

Sophomore Mariana Gould has gotten off to a scorching pace to 2016, holding a 7-0 record in singles so far this season. In addition to her singles record, she is 4-2 on the first doubles court along side Ellen Perez. Gould clinched Georgia's match against Old Dominion to seal the Bulldogs' spot at ITA Indoors, and she holds three doubles point clinchers with Perez.

» Home Sweet Home «

Georgia is currently riding a 17-match home winning streak, dating back to the 2014 postseason. The Bulldogs haven't lost at home in the regular season since falling 4-3 to Alabama on April 13, 2014, a streak of 13 matches. Georgia has won 38 of its last 39 regular-season matches at home, dating back to April of the 2012 season.

» All-Tournament Team «

Georgia's second doubles pair of Silvia Garcia and Caroline Brinson has found its footing, claiming wins in four consecutive dual matches. The pair went 3-0 at the ITA National Women's Team Indoor Championship, and it was rewarded with a spot on the All-Tournament team. The pair had limited time together before this season, entering play with just two matches together despite being on campus for two full seasons.

» SEC Honors Shaffer With POTW «

Kennedy Shaffer earned SEC Player of the Week honors on Feb. 10 for her performance at the ITA Indoor Championship. At the tournament, Shaffer went 3-0 while scoring two upset wins, one coming on the third and one on the fourth singles court. It was the second consecutive week that a Bulldog took home the honor, as Ellen Perez won the award a week earlier.

<u>» Perez Top Dog «</u>

Ellen Perez earned SEC Player of the Week honors on Feb. 3 after defeating the No. 1 singles player in the country, Joana Eidukonyte of Clemson, in three sets during Georgia's 7-0 win against the 20th-ranked Tigers. In the victory, Perez came back from down 1-0 in sets, 6-5 in games in the second set, and 3-0 in the second-set tie break. The Australia native won the super tiebreak abbreviated third set by a score of 10-3, winning the match by a score of 5-7, 7-6(8-6), 1-0 (10-3) for the Bulldogs' first victory over a No. 1 player since Perez's former doubles partner Lauren Herring knocked off Julia Elbaba of Virginia on Feb. 2, 2015.

» Dawgs Stand Alone «

With another trip to the semifinals at the ITA National Women's Team Indoor Championship in Madison, Wisconsin, Georgia established a claim as the only program in the country to reach last year's indoor semifinal, the NCAA Final Four and this year's indoor semis.

» Ellen at The Open «

Shellharbour, Australia native Ellen Perez received a wild card bid to compete in the Australian Open's doubles tournament alongside Florida's Belinda Woolcock. The pair fell in the first round to Australian professionals Jessica Moore and Storm Sanders 6-4, 6-2.

» Brinson Beasts in Southeast «

Junior Caroline Brinson entered the USTA/ITA Southeast Regional as the No. 72 player in the nation, but she took home the Southeast regional crown thanks to four victories over ranked opponents in the final three days of competition. Over that span, the New Orleans, La. native victimized the No. 5 (Josie Kuhlman, UF), No. 37 (Kennedy Shaffer, UGA), No. 38 (Kourtney Keegan, UF), and No. 6 (Stephanie Wagner, Miami) players in the country. Brinson was rewarded for her strong play with a boost in the rankings, checking in at No. 22 nationally in the ITA's initial spring poll.

» Aussie at All-Americans «

Ellen Perez punched her ticket to the ITA Indoor Championships in New York early on in the fall courtesy of a terrific display at the ITA All-American Championships in Los Angeles. By reaching the semifinals in both singles and doubles (alongside Mariana Gould), Perez became the first Bulldog to reach the final four in each side of the draw since Agata Cioroch in 2003. Since the inception of the tournament in 1988, Perez became just the 20th player to reach the semifinal in both singles and doubles.

» Wallace Is Winningest «

Head coach Jeff Wallace, now in the early part of his 31st season at the helm of Georgia's women's tennis program, has amassed 667 wins, five national championships, eight SEC crowns and six SEC Tournament trophies. Wallace is the winningest active head coach in women's collegiate tennis.



As the nation's winningest active women's tennis coach, Jeff Wal lace has built the Georgia Bulldogs into one of the elite college programs that both wins and plays host to NCAA Championships. The 2015-16 season will mark his 31st year with the Bulldogs.

In 2015, Wallace led a young Georgia squad to a 24-7 record and the program's 11th trip to the NCAA Semifinal round, played in Waco, Texas. The Bulldogs sported a roster with five freshmen and only three upperclassmen, but UGA ran through a difficult schedule to an impressive record, reached the SEC Tournament Championship and made its deepest run in the NCAA Tournament since 2009.

In 2014, Wallace garnered ITA Regional Coach of the Year honors after the Bulldogs enjoyed another banner season, going 24-5 with a final ranking of No. 4. Georgia captured the SEC Tournament title, the NCAA Tournament's No. 1 overall seed for the first time in school history, advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals plus saw the top duo of Lauren Herring and Maho Kowase reach the NCAA Doubles Final.

In 2013, Wallace became one of three coaches in women's tennis history to reach the 600-win plateau. He is one of five active collegiate tennis coaches with at least 600 wins, and is one of five UGA coaches to reach the mark. In 2009 following another memorable campaign when Georgia advanced to its 10th NCAA Final Four, Wallace became the first person to ever be named the Intercollegiate Tennis Association National Coach of the Year four times. The 2010 season featured Chelsey Gullickson winning the NCAA singles title at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex. The past four years, Georgia has finished the year ranked in the top eight after reaching the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championships.

A Proven Winner

During his tenure, Wallace's squads have claimed two NCAA championships, three USTA/ITA National Team Indoor titles, eight Southeastern Conference crowns and six SEC Tournament titles. A four-time National Coach of the Year recipient and four-time SEC Coach of the Year, Wallace's career record entering the 2016 season is 655-162. His .802 winning percentage is the best among active Division I coaches with a minimum of 500 victories.

Wallace's teams are the picture of consistency. With the 2015 NCAA bid, Georgia has appeared in 29 straight NCAA Tournaments and has advanced to the "Final Four" 10 times. Only once during his time as coach of the Bulldogs has the team missed the NCAA Tournament, and that was his first year back in 1986.

Playing/Coaching Career

A 1985 graduate of the University of Georgia, Wallace capped his playing career under legendary Bulldog head coach Dan Magill in 1984 after winning the SEC singles title at the No. 6 spot. The very next season, his first as coach of the Bulldogs, Wallace led a struggling team up the path of respectability by posting a 20-9 mark and landing a spot in the final Volvo Tennis/ITCA Top 25 poll. In 1987, just two years removed from a losing record, Georgia advanced to the national championship match. Although they didn't win it that year, the Bulldogs would have their day.

NCAA Champions

The 1994 season ranks as one of the most dominant ever in women's tennis history. It found Georgia on the champion's pedestal in every major team tournament possible: NCAA Champions, USTA/ITA National Team Indoor Champions, and SEC regular season and tournament champions. Top that all off with a 27-2 overall record including a perfect 14-0 SEC mark and a season sweep of arch-rival Florida and it's easy to see why Wallace was named coach of the year.

The 2000 Bulldogs went 27-2, winning the Southeastern

Conference title and the NCAA National Championship. In the title match on the campus of Pepperdine, Georgia dethroned the defending champion Stanford Cardinal 5-4, snapping a 48-match winning streak. Wallace was named the Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year.

USTA/ITA National Team Indoors

Under Wallace, the Bulldogs have been among the most successful teams at the USTA/ITA National Team Indoor Championships. The annual event attracts the nation's finest programs. The Bulldogs have won the title three times (1994, 1995, 2002) and have reached at least the semifinals 16 times.

Developing Talent

His record for developing players and having them maximize their potential has been evident throughout his tenure. Last season he guided the team to a 24-7 record and the program's 11th trip to the Final Four, the team's first trip to the NCAA Semifinal since 2009. The Bulldogs finished the season ranked No. 5 in the country. In 2013, the Bulldogs won their ninth regular season SEC championship after going 24-4 and clinching its third consecutive 20-plus win season. The Bulldogs went undefeated at home (14-0) for the first time since 2009 and 12th time in program history. In 2001, Agata Cioroch arrived from Poland and played No. 5 for the Bulldogs as a freshman. Two years later, she became Georgia's top talent and in 2004 was the No. 1-ranked player in college tennis for much of the season. Cioroch concluded her career as a five-time All-American with two grand slam singles titles.

Strong doubles teams are a key component for a successful college tennis team. There have been six Bulldog tandems under Wallace to finish the season ranked No. 1.

In 2009, two of Georgia's top players were freshmen: Chelsey Gullickson and Nadja Gilchrist, and by the end of the year they had earned All-America honors. Gullickson was named the ITA National Rookie of the Year, advanced to the NCAA Singles semifinals and tied a school record with 69 combined wins. Gullickson and Gilchrist became the first freshmen in school history to play No. 1 doubles in the lineup.

In 2010, the pair earned All-America honors again and Gullickson became the second Bulldog to win an NCAA singles title in Athens under Wallace and the third overall in the history of the program. She would finish her career in 2012 as the school's first ever eight-time All-American and own the record for victories. Meanwhile, Lauren Herring became the fourth Bulldog under Wallace to be named SEC Freshman of the Year and the sophomore All-SEC tandem of Maho Kowase and Lilly Kimbell posted a school record of their own by going 22-0 at No. 3.

While the depth of talent can vary each season, the results remain consistent. This was no more evident than in 2002. Despite having only one player earn All-America honors, Georgia went undefeated during the regular season, won the USTA/ITA National Team Indoor title, the SEC championship and advanced to the NCAA "Final Four." The 2002 squad finished with a 26-2 record and final national ranking of No. 3. Georgia went 13-0 at home and extended its home winning streak to 50 straight.

Success in the Wallace Era

In 26 of the past 30 seasons, Georgia has finished with a top-10 national ranking including No. 1 in 1994 and 2000. In the Wallace era, seven Bulldogs have won grand slam titles, two have won the Honda-Broderick Award/tennis, 31 Bulldogs have earned All-America honors 98 times, and 51 different Bulldogs have been listed on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
