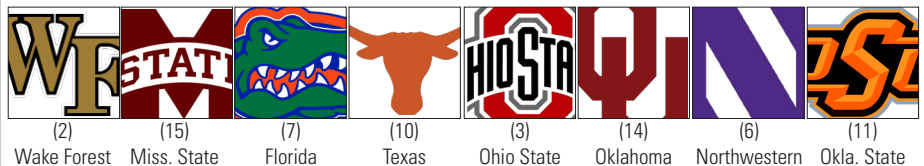

## BACK-TO-BACK FOR PONWITH

Bulldog freshman Nathan Ponwith, who played at the No. 3 court during ITA Kick-Off weekend, was named the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week following the two wins. The Scottsdale, Ariz. native also earned the honor the second week of the season following the first dual-match of the year win against Georgia Tech and has now earned the first two SEC Freshman of the Week awards of the season.

Ponwith arrived in Athens as the No. 1 recruit in the nation for the 2016 class, helping Georgia land the top-ranked class in the country. He went 8-4 in the fall and picked up five doubles wins. He has joined Walker Duncan and Wayne Montgomery as current Georgia players that have earned freshman honors from the SEC.

## FIVE IN A ROW?

The Bulldogs were selected the preseason favorite to win the 2017 Southeastern Conference Championship in a vote by league coaches. The Bulldogs received 168 points in the poll, while Florida was the next closest with 151 and Kentucky came in at No. 3 with 133 total points. Georgia, winners of the last four SEC titles, will look to make it five in a row for the first time since they won each year from 1971-1975.

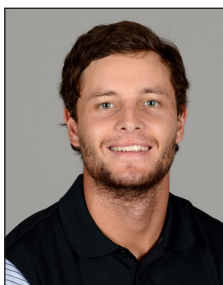
